HEALTH ROOM UPDATE

Our 'Lil Pirates may still be experiencing seasonal allergies i.e. watery eyes, scratchy throats, sneezing, coughing with runny noses. Remember all these symptoms can also be recognized as COVID symptoms with or without fever. The Health Aide, Mrs. Rader, may only administer medication to your student if she has been authorized by your student's medical provider and parent. OTC Cough drops, nasal sprays/solution, lotions, eye drops CAN NOT be brought to school by your student to self-administer. Please remember to keep your child at home if they have either one of these symptoms: a fever, diarrhea or vomiting.

If your little pirate will begin or has begun medication for a chronic condition that would have to be administered at any time during the school day, please contact Mrs. Rader - the Health Aide at ext. 2247. Your child CAN ONLY self-carry an asthma inhaler/Epi-pen if the Medication Administration Authorization packet has been completed, signed off and on file by your student's medical provider and their parent.

Please understand Health Aides cannot medically assess the severity of a medical condition and if at any time a student's condition is deemed critical – 911 will be contacted first and the parents will be contacted thereafter.

Please be sure to send your student with a water bottle or water container marked with their name for daily consumption. Stay healthy and if you have any questions, please contact Mrs. Rader at ext. 2247.
