ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES

Advanced Placement is a national academic program administered by the College Board. The College Board trains teachers and audits syllabi and courses. In May, students take a nationally administered AP exam for each AP course in which they are enrolled. These exams are graded on a scale of 1 to 5. A score of 3 is generally considered passing and passing scores usually count for college credit. However, colleges and universities vary in how they view AP so passing scores can differ from college to college and from exam to exam. Student and parents should research how the colleges they are interested in treat AP. Students who enroll in AP classes at FBHS are required to sit for the exam in May. The score a student receives on the AP exam does not impact a student's grade in class and AP scores are rarely reviewed for college admission purposes.

AP courses are conducted at a college level and there is a high expectation of students. AP Placement is subject to teacher and/or counselor recommendation. Generally, AP students should score at a 4 or 5 on relevant state exams, make an 85% or better in prior honors courses, and hold a 3.5 or better unweighted GPA. AP credits are weighted.

CAREER AND TECHNICAL PROGRAMS AT FBHS

In conjunction with the Nassau Technical Center, Fernandina Beach High School offers both high school and college credit programs in a variety of careers. Students can earn job-training, industry credentials, and credits toward a college degree while in high school. A description of each program is listed below.

- **Academy of Culinary Arts**

This program provides the training and practice needed to prepare students for a postsecondary culinary program or an entry level position in the food service or hospitality industry. The course of study includes instruction in sanitation, customer service, purchasing and receiving, and time management. Students will have an opportunity to explore catering opportunities for school and community organizations.

- **Aerospace Technologies**

Aerospace Technologies mission is to foster wonder and excitement in students interested in the Aerospace Field. The 4-year program uses model rocketry and radio-controlled aircraft to teach physics and aerodynamics, and basic computer simulators to introduce aircraft flight operations. Students in AT1/2 create flying models using Computer-Aided Design/Computer Aided-Manufacture (CAD/CAM) processes. Students in AT3/4 will explore the knowledge required to pass the FAA Private Pilot Knowledge Exam (e.g., Federal Aviation Regulations, Weather, Navigation, Aircraft Operations, the National Airspace System, etc.) Courses are taught by an FAA-license Flight Instructor.

- **Business**

Business students learn the real-world computer skills. The course offerings include Introduction to Information Technology, Business Software Administration and Principles of Entrepreneurship/Business.

- **Diversified Career Technology (DCT)/On Job Training(OJT)**

This program is designed to provide students with the opportunity to stimulate their career interest in business. Students will enhance and apply the instruction competencies learned in the classroom with the internship experience. Students will be able to develop human relation, communication and employability skills needed to secure a position in the workforce.

CAREER AND TECHNICAL PROGRAMS AT FBHS

- **Introduction to Electricity**

This program focuses on broad, transferable skills, stresses the understanding of all aspects of the electricity industry, and demonstrates such elements of the industry as planning, management, finance, technical and production skills, underlying principles of technology, labor issues, community issues, and health, safety, and environmental issues.

- **Health Care/Pre-Medical**

This program is a Florida State Board of Nursing approved Nursing Assistant course. The rigorous curriculum prepares students for clinical rotations at Baptist Medical Center, Quality Health, Amelia Internal Medicine, Amelia Urgent Care, and the offices of local physicians. Students are expected to demonstrate mastery of curriculum that includes anatomy, physiology, medical terminology, legal and ethical issues, patient's rights and leadership. Upon completion of the program, students sit for the state of Florida Certified Nursing Assistant exam and are prepared to pursue a career as an LPN, RN, or other job opportunities in the medical field.

- **Digital Media**

The Digital Media program provides students with an avenue for introduction to the world of graphic design, photography, and computer skills. While students are learning graphic design, they will also learn real life skills in critical thinking and business. In the foundation course, Digital Media 1, students will be instructed in Adobe Photoshop and Adobe Illustrator and will need to be proficient in computer design skills to master both. In Digital Media 2, they will learn how to create video using the industry standard programs of both Adobe Premiere Pro and Adobe After Effects. In Digital Media 3, using previous knowledge of graphic design, students will learn how to create websites using Adobe Dreamweaver. They will also learn how to develop animations and certify in Adobe Animate.

- **Hospitality & Tourism**

The purpose of this course is to introduce students to the skills necessary for success in the hospitality and tourism industry. Students will also have the opportunity to learn hospitality and tourism terminology and the mathematical, economic, marketing, and sales fundamentals of the industry.

Eligibility Requirements

- Students must have an unweighted high school GPA of at least 3.0 based on at least 4 full high school credits to include 1 year of high school English and 1 year of mathematics at the level of Algebra I or higher
- Student must have College ready Test Scores on ACT, SAT, PERT, or Accuplacer

*Test scores must be within 2 years of the start of the courses to which they apply.

Program Requirements

- Students must be college ready by taking a placement test (i.e. PERT, Accuplacer, SAT/ACT). Students can take up to 12 credits before they need to be College ready in Math.
- Students and parents are not permitted to perform any registration activity—adding/dropping/changing courses
- Students must earn a passing grade in every course they attempt

Course Selection

- Students must take courses that give dual credit—high school and college credit—Florida Dual Enrollment Equivalency List
- Focus on courses that feed into the Associate of Arts degree—36 hours of General Education +24 hours of elective credit to meet University major prerequisites
- Students must complete 15 hours of State Core General Education prior to earning a total of 24 credit hours

Types of Dual Enrollment

- Traditional Dual Enrollment—Students are part-time students, taking classes on high school site, on College campus, or online, limited to 9-11 credit hours per semester, typically 3 classes.
- Early Admission—Senior level students who are full-time students at the College, taking classes on campus or online, typically taking 12-14 credit hours per semester, typically 4 classes

Miscellaneous Information

- Students with disabilities must self-report and provide documentation to the College in order to receive services.
- FERPA form—In order for Dual Enrollment Office to communicate with Parents or Guardians, the student must sign a FERPA form
- Faculty must NEVER be approached by parents or guardians—all communication must be done through the Dual Enrollment Office
