

Fact Sheet for Dual Enroll EMT Program at Nassau Center

Purpose:

Prepares graduates to function as entry-level Emergency Medical Technicians. The program utilizes classroom instruction, hands-on skills labs, and field experiences to train students to become emergency medical responders who respond to a variety of medical and trauma situations. Upon completion of the program, graduates are awarded a technical certificate and are eligible to apply to sit for the National Registry Emergency Medical Technician (NREMT) certification exam to qualify for certification as a Florida EMT. Graduates of the technical certificate program may elect to continue for the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) (2251) (A.S.) degree.

Eligibility:

- Meet FSCJ/NCSD requirements for Dual enrolled status (Academic Plan 3408D) deadline September 30, 2025
- 18 years old by August 31, 2026
- Required to complete background check, fingerprinting and drug screening, after acceptance to the program, prior to being enrolled.
- Health physical exam and immunizations before first week of class.

Costs:

- Per FSCJ/NCSD agreement
 - Tuition and Textbooks
- Payment by NCSD depending on funding, otherwise student out-of-pocket
 - American Databank Packet (Background, Fingerprinting, Drug Screening and Immunization Tracking)
 - Certification fees for EMT Exam after course completion
- Student out-of-pocket
 - Uniform and Equipment
