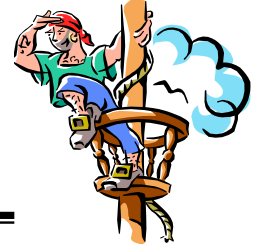

Mornings at FBMS

The school day for FBMS students begins at 8:55 a.m. The first bus arrives at 8:45 a.m. Students should not be on campus before 8:40 a.m. unless they are participating in a school activity. Please arrange for your student to be off campus until this time. Students arriving before 8:45 a.m. should report to the cafeteria. Please contact the school if your student must arrive before 8:00 a.m.

Please remember that the only appropriate location for dropping off or picking up students is in front of the school. Please do not drop off or pick up your student in the back of the school, on the side of the school, or on Beech St. These locations are all inappropriate loading and/or unloading zones. Thank you!

PARENT CONFERENCES

Teachers are available to meet with parents most Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday mornings for conferences at 8:10 a.m. or 8:30 a.m. Parents may arrange for an individual conference, a conference with a few, or a conference with all of the student's teachers. We have found that it is typically most beneficial for students when parents meet with the entire team of a student's teachers. Teachers are scheduled for a variety of meetings before school so parent conferences must be scheduled in advance. Please contact the guidance office to set up your conference, and we will process your request as soon as possible.

BREAKFAST

Breakfast is available in our school cafeteria each school day from 8:40 a.m. until 8:55 a.m. The cost of breakfast is \$1.75 for students.



Clinic Information



Our school nurse is available to help students with medical concerns in our health clinic. The health clinic is located in room 03-03 and is open daily from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Both prescribed and over-the-counter medications administered during school hours must be kept in the clinic and must have proper documentation. Proper documentation includes written justification from the physician as well as a medication form filled out by the parent. All medication must be brought to the school by the parent.

In addition, all seventh grade students are required to have their immunization record up-to-date before entering the 7th grade. If the student does not have the required shots, he/she will not be able to enter school. If your student has recently received a required shot, please bring evidence of the shot (including the date given) to the clinic. Thank you!

Our Daily Schedule

The daily schedule at FBMS includes a **six period day** with fifty-five minute classes. Students eat lunch with their fourth period class. Students have three minutes between classes and will be marked tardy if they are late to class. After the student is marked tardy three times, disciplinary action will be taken. Please encourage your student to be on time to class!

LUNCH

Students have the option to bring their own lunch or to purchase lunch in the cafeteria. The cafeteria offers a daily menu selection as well as a la carte items. Lunch costs \$2.75 for students and \$4.25 for adults. Payment options for school lunch include sending money or a check to be put into the student's account or using an online method of payment. Our online system of payment is changing and additional information will be provided at the start of the school year. Some students may qualify to receive either free or reduced lunch. AFTER SCHOOL

The school day ends for students at 3:20 p.m. (and 2:20 p.m. on Wednesdays). Students should not be on campus after 3:30 p.m. unless they are participating in the Communities In Schools' Academic Program, a school athletic program, or some other after school activity. Please make arrangements for your student to be off campus at the appropriate time.

2017 - 2018 FBMS Dress Code

To alleviate any unnecessary problems regarding student clothing, please familiarize yourself with this dress code. The dress code will be strictly enforced.

Students Are NOT Permitted To Wear:

- Even under a jacket or sweater, clothing that
 - is overly tight, distracting, or revealing
 - has rips, holes, or has been cut up or see through
 - is not properly fastened
 - does not cover the midriff whether sitting or raising hand
 - contains words, phrases, symbols, pictures, or insignia which are obscene, profane, distracting, suggestive or advertise alcohol/ tobacco products
 - has spaghetti straps
 - has been written on with marker, pens, etc.
- Short shorts or jogging shorts
- Mesh tops or other clothing that is see through (these are allowed ONLY with clothing underneath that meets dress code requirements. For example, a sheer top must have an undergarment that is at least 3 inches wide across the shoulders and covers the midriff. No spaghetti straps, camisoles, or bras are allowed to show.)
- Midriff shirts
- Tank tops, halter tops, or tube tops
- Backless dresses or strapless dresses (including homecoming dances)
- Pajamas or any kind of sleep wear
- Headgear including
 - hats or caps or hoods

(Students will be permitted to wear soft hats during cold weather—outside the classroom.)

- sunglasses
- headbands that are distracting
- hair grooming accessories in hair

Confiscated head gear will be returned at the end of the school year.

- Gloves inside the classroom
- Shoes such as
 - flip flops
 - bedroom slippers
 - shoes with heels and soles that measure greater than 1½"
 - opened toed athletic rubber slides or sandals that do not have a strap across the back heel

Students may wear all other backless type shoes (closed toe).

Students will wear shoes at all times, except when directed differently by teacher.

- Jewelry intended for body piercing, excessive necklaces and bracelets (limited to one necklace and two bracelets at a time), chains or metal objects attached to clothing or accessories.

Students are limited to two earrings on each ear.

FBMS is NOT responsible for the loss of jewelry and strongly recommends that students do not wear jewelry during the school day.

- Hairstyles, haircuts, or hair dyeing/coloring that distracts from the learning environment. For example, a hair color that isn't found in humans, such as pink, purple, blue, green, orange, bright red (as opposed to auburn, blond, brunette). etc.
- Hair grooming accessories in hair (in addition combing, brushing, or otherwise dressing hair is not permitted anywhere except in the restrooms)
- Make-up that distracts from the learning process
- Tattoos or markings on the skin of any kind

PIRATE WAY OF LIFE: Positive Behavior System at FBMS

The core values we are trying to develop our students to exhibit at FBMS are the **5 R's: Respectful, Resourceful, Responsible, Resilient, and Reflective.**

We hope by helping to develop these qualities our students will be able to display these behaviors in all actions and in all things on our campus and in our community. Students will receive recognition / rewards when staff and faculty observe the positive behaviors!

We are very excited about the impact this program has to promote positive climate and a culture of success at Fernandina Middle. If you have any input or questions, please contact us in the Guidance office.

Secondary (6-12) Students Will Wear:

- Shirts with sleeves
(Sleeveless shirts must be three inches wide at the shoulder and should be hemmed or capped.)
- Hemmed pants
 - Pants will be the proper length
 - Pants must reside at the waist and cannot hang any lower
- Hemmed shorts
 - no shorter than 3 inches above the top of the knee cap as measured from the front or back of the leg even if leggings or pants are worn underneath
 - shorts must reside at the waist and cannot hang any lower

In Addition, Secondary Female Students May Wear:

- Hemmed skirts / dresses
 - No shorter than 3 inches above the top of the knee cap as measured from the front or back of the leg even if leggings or pants are worn underneath
- All form fitting pants must be covered with a shirt or dress that is no shorter than 5 inches from the top of the knee
- Strapless dresses are not allowed during the school day or during school dances (including Homecoming)

Personal cleanliness will be consistent with the maintenance of good physical health and the avoidance of giving offense to others.

Attendance:

If your student misses a day of school, please submit an excuse to the front office or first period teacher. Parents can excuse 3 days per nine weeks with a note, but beyond those days, the policy requires a doctor's note. You can monitor your student's attendance using FOCUS. Attending regularly contributes to improved academic performance. Failure to comply with compulsory attendance laws can lead to legal problems.

FBMS is NOT responsible for the loss of cell phones, Ipods, mp3 players, tablets or any electronic devices and strongly suggests that students do not bring these items to school.



Important Information about Cell Phones

Cell phones are permitted on campus, however they are brought at the student's own risk. Students are not permitted to use a cell phone during school hours (8:55 - 3:20 p.m., 2:20 p.m. on early release days) or during detention (8:15 a.m. - 8:45 a.m.). Phones must be kept in the backpack (not in pockets) & should never be taken out during these times. Cell phones cannot have the ringer or lights on & cannot be in vibrate mode. Cell phones should never be used for texting or for taking pictures or video recordings while on school grounds before, during, or after school hours. Cell phones are to be used for verbal communication only. Any student using cell phones for video or picture purposes will receive an automatic three to five day In School or Out of School Suspension. When a cell phone is used for texting or picture/video purposes, is out during school hours, or has lights, ringer, or vibrate mode on, the cell phone will be confiscated & only returned to the parent (upon the parent's request) by the principal. Following the second incident that a cell phone is used during school hours, the cell phone may be kept until the final day of school. It is not our intent to take phones from students, but rather to ensure a proper orderly school environment. FBMS is not responsible for lost or stolen phones, and is not responsible for what a student is viewing on someone else's phone (pictures, texted messages, etc.).

Middle School Student Responsibility

As we begin a new school year, we would like to encourage all students to record assignments in their agendas on a daily basis. We ask that parents sit down each evening and review assignments with their students. It is very important that students understand the importance of doing assignments as assigned and turning these assignments in on time as well. Students' grades are affected by late work and not turning in work as required. Parents should review each course syllabus with their students. The middle school years are a time for increased responsibility and accountability for students in their assignments and academic progress. We hope that all our students have a successful 2017 - 2018 school year. We will be implementing organizational strategies through AVID, an internationally recognized program used to develop strong students. Students will be using one 3 inch binder to organize all of their class materials as one part of the AVID strategies. You can learn more about AVID by visiting www.avid.org.

FOCUS INFORMATION

Your FOCUS account gives you access to email your teachers, monitor grades, and access weekly lesson plans. These can be found under the "Course Webpage" section of each course on the student's page. Grades are updated at least every two weeks. User names and passwords are the same as previous years. New students to Nassau County can get their user name and password from any of their teachers or guidance.

News from the FBMS Guidance Office

Get ready, students! The beginning of the 2017-2018 school year is fast approaching and FBMS guidance counselors, Robin Lentz & Ali Ehrman (filling in for Erin Land due to maternity leave) are eagerly awaiting your return. Your counselors will be back in the office starting July 18th to answer any questions that you may have. We hope that parents and students remember throughout the school year that the FBMS guidance department is available to help ensure student success in middle school and visits from our students and parents are always welcome. There are a variety of services available in the guidance office. Individual and small group counseling are available to all students in many areas including personal problems, peer-related problems, family-related issues, grief or loss issues, academic issues, and improving study skills. We can also provide assistance and referral for those who require more intensive counseling. We would like to remind students and parents that at FBMS we have a zero tolerance policy on bullying. Please encourage your student to report any problems experienced or observed with bullies to a teacher, guidance counselor, or administrator. Reporting bullies shows that a student has self-respect and is willing to take appropriate and necessary steps to help themselves. Also, we would like to remind students that school consequences can and will be implemented when acts of cyber bullying (on-line harassment) become a distraction to the learning environment. We encourage parents to monitor their student's on-line activity. We are looking forward to a terrific school year! 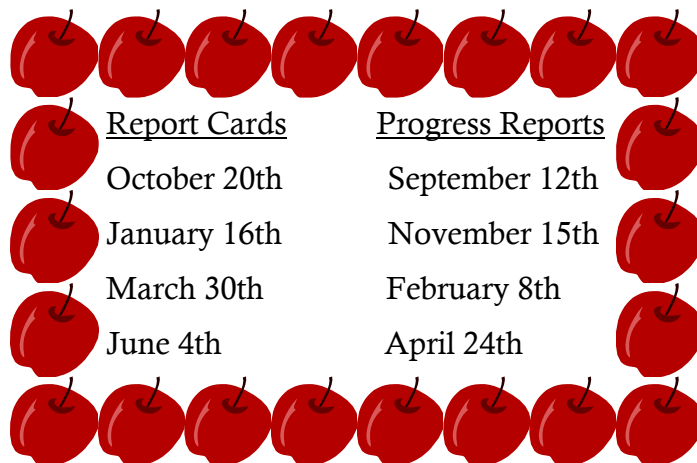
Your Student's Schedule

Please be aware that your student may be assigned to an Intensive Reading class if he/she scored below grade level on state assessments. This course will allow ample time to improve reading skills and remediate deficiencies. Assignment to math classes will be based on state assessment scores, previous grades, placement tests, and teacher recommendation. As always, your student's first period teacher will be posted the day before the first day of school on the gymnasium and auditorium doors. Students will receive class schedules from their home-room teachers on the first day of school, August 10th. Sixth grade students and new students attending the New Student Orientation on August 8th will have access to their schedules on that day. Returning students' schedules will not be released until the first day of school.
