A Message to Our Parents

We are settling into the 2017-2018 school year here at FBMS. August and September were definitely busy months for everyone. Our annual Open House was held on August 28th and we had an overwhelming turnout. We were excited to see and meet so many new parents and welcome them to their students' classrooms. It is always fun to see parents go through their students' schedules to experience a typical day in the life of their child. You can check your students' grades and weekly lesson plans on our grade and attendance system, FOCUS and through Google Classroom. Students have their logins to access FOCUS and Google Classroom. If you have not been able to access FOCUS, please contact Guidance.

Remember, it is important to send in absence notes when your student misses school. A parent note can excuse three days per nine week period; after that, a doctor's note is needed. If your child is absent for more than one day, you can request make up work by calling the front office. Please allow at least 24 hours for teachers to gather the work needed. More information about attendance can be found in your child's agenda book.

We are excited to be in year three of the district wide initiative, Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS), that we began implementing two years ago. This is a multi-year grant that will change the climate at all our schools. At FBMS we are continuing with our Pirate Way of Life school wide expectations for all our students. We want students to exhibit Respectful, Responsible, Resourceful, Resilient and Reflective behavior (the "5 R's"). We will be rewarding students as we see them exhibiting these expectations in classes, buses, cafeteria, hallways and thus school wide. Surveys will be completed by students, staff and parents to help us in this process and monitor the implementation.

October and November hold many exciting opportunities for FBMS parents and students. We hope you will join us for our annual Fall Family BBQ from 5-7 p.m. on Friday, November 3rd. This is always a fun event for the entire family with performances by our band, cheerleaders and drama class. 




FOCUS



The first nine weeks is passing very quickly. We want to remind parents of the importance of students using their agenda book as a tool for organizing their assignments and time management. We suggest parents review assignments with

their students and help them stay organized by reviewing their binders and backpacks. Often students will say they have completed an assignment when in fact they have not. It is important for you to see their completed work. In Guidance, we counsel students about what a zero can do to their grade. Please take the time do discuss the importance of completing all of their assignments. You can also check FOCUS to track their assignments and grades earned. The website for **FOCUS** www.focus.nassau.k12.fl.us. Many assignments and other information is available to your student through Google Classroom. Your student can access that for you by using their Thinkpad/Chromebook.

It is a challenge to find the proper balance in giving your middle schooler independence versus micro-managing their school work and time. You will have to figure out what works best for your child and your family. The most important idea to keep in mind is that if it is important to you, it will be important to them. Our Guidance Office is here to help you and your child be successful. Please do not hesitate to reach out to your child's teachers or counselors. The assessment calendar for specific dates of tests is in the process of being finalized. The following is a general time frame of testing and we will communicate the specific dates of the tests in the next newsletter and on our website:

PSAT: October 11 (8th grade only, paper-based)

1st Semester Civics EOC: mid December (computer-based)

6-8 Writing: last week in February (6th & 7th paper-based, 8th computer-based)

6-8 Reading: mid April (computer-based) 6-8 Mathematics: mid/end of April (computer-based)

Algebra EOC: beginning of May (computerbased, students not required to take FSA Mathematics test)

2nd Semester Civics EOC: beginning of May (computer-based)

8 FCAT Science: last week in April (paper-based)

For the computer-based testing, students will used their own Chromebooks. Students can take practice tests at www.fldoe.org.


