

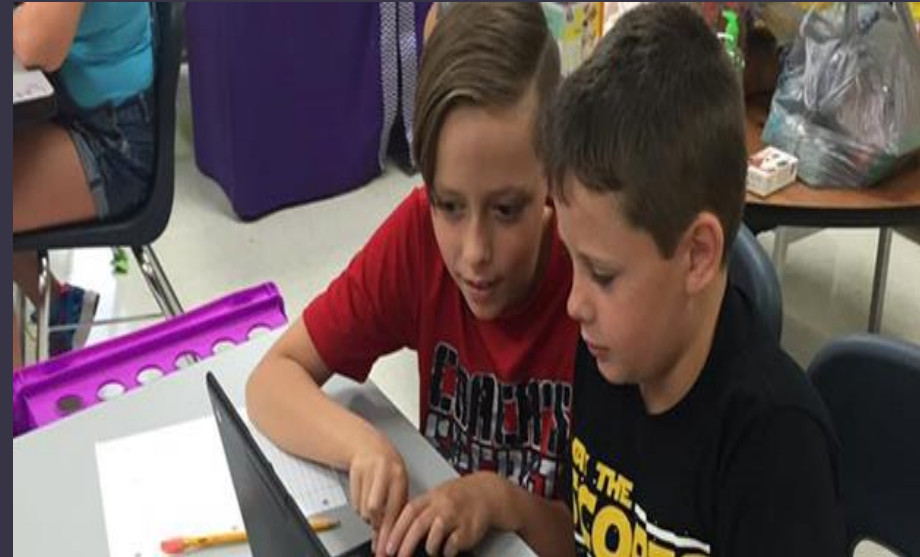


Title I Annual Parent Meeting

How You Know If Your Child Is Being Successful

Progress will be monitored using:

- Lexia, i-Ready, STAR, MobyMax, etc.
- Weekly Basal Assessments
- Florida Standards Assessments (FSA)

Weekly folders will be sent home with your child's work. Also, please remember to access Focus for your child's current grades.
