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

The Child Advocate Rapid Response Team (C.A.R.R.T.) is a school-based program that provides advocacy for children and their families who are victims of/or witnesses to a crime or violence. We provide services to children that may be experiencing difficulties in their home or at school.

We provide services to all Nassau County Schools and other educational settings: Hilliard Elementary, Hilliard Middle Senior High, Bryceville Elementary, Callahan Elementary, Callahan Intermediate, Callahan Middle, West Nassau High, Wildlight Elementary, Yulee Primary, Yulee Elementary, Yulee Middle, Yulee High, Southside Elementary, Emma Love Hardee Elementary, Fernandina Beach Middle, Fernandina Beach High, Bean Center, Community Schools (Adult ED), & Alternative School.

The mission of the Child Advocate Rapid Response Team (C.A.R.R.T.) is to provide services to children who have been the victims of /or witness to a crime or violence with the goal of reducing the overall incidence of revictimization.

Types of Victimization
