
Dear Parent/Guardian,

In March 2022, Governor Ron DeSantis signed new legislation that replaces the grade-level Florida Standards Assessments (FSA) in English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics with the Coordinated Screening and Progress Monitoring System, also called the Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST). FAST Progress Monitoring (PM) assessments are administered three times during the school year. The first administration of FAST (PM 1) was given from August 15 through October 7, 2022.

For this transitional year, teachers and families need to understand that FAST Progress Monitoring (PM 1) information is intended to provide baseline results. These results are for informational purposes only and should be used to identify areas that may need additional instruction and support. Beginning and mid-year FAST results should not be considered student achievement designations. FAST (PM 3), administered at the end of the school year, is intended to provide a summative score, measuring student proficiency in the grade-level content standards.

Your child's score may be lower than their Spring 2022 FSA / Stanford 10 score. This is to be expected because FAST (PM 1) measures proficiency in your child's current grade level standards to which they have not yet been exposed but will be taught throughout the school year.
