GRADING STANDARDS

Homework/Notebook Checks Clinicals/Labs	50%	No 'late work' will be accepted. Homework will be kept in a notebook. If present when the work was assigned, it is due the day you return from your absence.
Quizzes/Tests/Projects CNA State Certification Exams will count as 2 test grades each.	50%	Policy is the same as Homework/Clinicals. State Exam is 2 part: written and skills. Each part will count as 2 test grades.

Participation is essential and expected in the Health Science Block. This is evaluated on a 100%, 70% or 0% level based on the level of participation. (Example: sleeping during class = 0%; refusal to participate in a lab = 0%; acting as a patient and NOT actually performing the lab = 70%; refusing to act as a patient and performing a lab skill = 70%)

If an assignment or exam is assigned prior to your absence, you will take the exam or turn in the assignment the day you return to class. Plan to come BEFORE school to take the exam the day you return. NO EXCEPTIONS.

If you are absent when the assignment or exam was assigned, you have 5 days to make-up the work/exam. **It is YOUR responsibility to schedule the make-up exams.** Make-up exams are NOT given during class. If homework/exam is not turned in or completed by the end of day 5 of your return, you will receive a 'zero' for the homework/exam.

It is your responsibility to obtain missed handouts, homework assignments and class notes. Talk with your classmates regarding information covered during your absence. If a project was assigned, see me after class or after school.

An overall grade of no less than 80% is required for Health Care Foundations and Nursing Assistant 3 each quarter to attend clinical in January, 2018.
