Presentations/Discussions

1. Welcome/Introductions and explaining of SAC

Welcomed and thanked all stakeholders for coming. Gave a little speech about what is SAC. The agenda was very detailed about this item.

2. Voting in new members-Parents, Teacher Memberships, Election of SAC Chair:

3. New Business

- Data Results- FSA ELA/Math/Science in 5th Grade was the highest in the county, SAT 10 for K-2 has shown great improvement in Reading and Math, Progress Monitoring (STAR, iReady, FAST). New Progress Monitoring FAST/Cambium will be used this year. Testing will be done three times a year. PM 1 window will close September 30th.
- Discussion of the BES Title One Parent and Family Engagement Plan: What barriers to participation do you perceive? Some barriers that were discussed were the time frames/days of the week that an event fell on. It was discussed varying the time frames, supplying dinners, and switching up days to help parents.
- Comprehensive Needs Assessment for Title One: Based on FTE (Full Time Equivalent) which refers to the unit of measurement for our student enrollment. 2022-2023 Title One Budget was explained in detailed. Title One is the largest FEDERAL funded program. Supplies have gone up in cost this year.
- School Improvement Plan: 2022-2023 plans are in progress. We know as a whole school we need to increase our Reading, Math, Science and Parental Involvement this year. Members asked how we could increase our reading. The school is working very hard in grades K-3 on phonics skills and closing the gaps in this area. Grades 4-5 are working on closing some gaps but also comprehension.
