
GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- 4 English Credits
- 4 Math Credits (Algebra 1 and Geometry)
- 3 Science Credits (Biology)
- 3 Social Studies Credits (World History, US History and US Govt ½ & Economics ½)
- 1 Fine, Performing, Practical Art or CTE Credit
- 1 HOPE Credit
- 7.5 Elective Credits
- .5 Personal Finance
- 2.0 Unweighted Grade Point Average (GPA)
- Successfully Pass All Required Testing
 - Algebra 1 End of Course Exam
 - 10th Grade Reading FSA



Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST)

- Students take English courses 9th & 10th grade at YHS to prepare for the graduation requirement FAST ELA test
- Students who scored a level 1 or 2 on middle school FAST ELA testing, may be enrolled in Intensive Reading course for extra help
- Students must attempt the exam at least 1 time
- If students do not pass, they will retake it until they pass



COURSE SELECTION PROCESS AND DEADLINES

- Students are placed in core courses based on academic achievement in their current core placements, test scores and teacher recommendations
- Students request electives during Spring of the current school year (on a course request hand out) before course request deadline
- Course selection is due _____ for the 25-26 school year
- Students can request course changes for core classes during the first week of each semester through our course request form

ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES

- Advanced placement (AP) courses offer students the opportunity to take more rigorous courses and potentially earn college credits.
- Students must pass the AP exam at the end of the course to earn college credits
- AP courses we offer include AP US History, AP English/Composition, AP Psychology, and AP Computer Science (not all are offered to 9th grade students)



DUAL ENROLLMENT AND EARLY ADMISSIONS

- Dual enrollment courses are offered in partnership with FSCJ
- Courses offered at YHS and FSCJ
- Must have a **3.0 unweighted GPA** and **qualifying test scores** on the SAT, ACT, or Accuplacer
- Must take SLS 1103:Strategies for Success in College before taking additional DE courses
- Early Admissions = full course schedule at FSCJ (*only available to seniors with 3.5 weighted GPA and qualifying test scores*)



THINGS TO CONSIDER

Weighted Credit

High School Courses designated Honors, Dual Enrollment, or AP are weighted for high school GPA.

Example A $4.0 = 5.0$

B $3.0 = 4.0$

Colleges DO NOT weight these courses the same when determining acceptances.

Honors credit courses are only weighted .5 credit for college GPA

Example A $4.0 = 4.5$

B $3.0 = 3.5$

BRIGHT FUTURES SCHOLARSHIP

Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program Florida Academic Scholarship (FAS) / Florida Medallion Scholarship (FMS) 2021-22

Initial Eligibility Requirements: (As determined by the Department of Education)

1. Submit the Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) no later than August 31 after high school graduation,
2. Complete the 16 college-preparatory courses required for admission to a state university,
3. Achieve the required weighted GPA in the 16 college-preparatory courses per chart below,
4. Complete the required number of service hours per chart below, and
5. Achieve the required composite ACT¹ or combined SAT¹ score per chart below.

¹ The required coursework aligns with the State University System admission requirements found in Florida Board of Governor's Regulation 6.002. Information regarding high school coursework can be found in the Florida Counseling for Future Education Handbook.

Requirements to Receive an Award: (As determined by the postsecondary institution)

1. Be evaluated by the Office of Student Financial Assistance (OSFA) as meeting initial eligibility requirements,
2. Graduate with a standard high school diploma or its equivalent,
3. Be a Florida resident and U.S. citizen or eligible noncitizen, and
4. Enroll as a degree- or certificate-seeking student at a Florida institution in at least 6 non-remedial semester credit hours.

Renewal Requirements: (As determined by grade and hours submitted by the postsecondary institution)

1. Students must earn the number of credit hours based on the student's enrollment type per term, and
2. The renewal cumulative GPA requirements are outlined in the table below.

	Florida Academic Scholars (FAS)	Florida Medallion Scholars (FMS)
Minimum Cumulative GPA (unrounded and unweighted)	3.0	2.75


