Presentations/Discussions:

- District parent and Family Engagement Plan: the committee was shown the District Parent and Family Engagement Plan
 - a. Review of current plan: areas of concern from the District Parent and Family Engagement Plan were the two areas of 63% and 68% where parents responded. 63% of parents said they received information about their child's learning goals/targets and curriculum based on the Benchmarks of Excellent Student Thinking (B.E.S.T) standards. Committee members thought this was low, especially when standard nights are held and posted on social media (Facebook, school's websites, flyers, school calendars. The other area of 68% of parents said their child's school informed them that they can become a member of the School Advisory Council (SAC) to develop and review the school and district Parent and Family Engagement Plans, School Improvement Plan, etc. Again, the committee members thought this was low based on the amount of school advertising through flyers, school newsletters, school calendars, and social media (Facebook, websites etc.) going out to parents throughout the school year. Other areas were looked at and talked about such as: some word changes, adding examples and/or clarifications to the District Parent and Family Engagement Plan.

2. Title 1 Budget

a. Comprehensive Needs Assessment: Comprehensive Needs Assessment was shown to the committee. Items to be implemented are a one full time paraprofessional and one part time paraprofessional would be hired to help with strategic focus during center rotations in reading, continuing the before, during and after school tutoring, along with providing substitutes for paras when they are not present. The school also budgeted for resources and classroom materials provided for teachers such as supplies and websites (IXL etc.) This will include student folders for parent involvement and communication. Data from PM3 was shared with the members along with the review School Grades Report on the FL

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DOE website. We have received an "A" rating for 2023. Members were very pleased with the information. We are very proud of the Staff and Faculty Members.

- Feedback on needs: committee agreed to the following above areas and keeping them as part of the budget for the following year.
- b. Parent Involvement Funds: no input was given, besides agreeing to how the funds were being used (student folders, standard nights, pushing standards/assessment information out, and continue to offer high demand events throughout the year)
 - i. Needs or changes to how these funds were spent? Committee agrees to how the funds are spent.
- c. Committee Input: everyone is very pleased with the budget and where the money is going to. Everyone was allowed to see/read the Comprehension Needs Chart. Each line was gone over in detail with the members.
