Presentations/Discussions:

- 1. School 23-24 Budget: It was explained that there are two types of budgets (County and Title 1). The school budget is \$65K. Personnel is allotted \$54K. Title 1 is based on free and reduced lunches. We did receive \$11k extra for 2023-2024 school year. With this extra money, we are looking at hiring an extra half-day para for the 2023-2024 school year. He/she would be helping in the classroom with either small group reading and or math centers. We already use Title 1 one money for our Reading Coach tutoring, hiring a full time para, insurance for employee (para-if they need it), IXL subscription to add on ELA, books for Beach Blanket Bingo, Heidi songs subscription (alphabet, brain breaks, sight words, numbers and primary math, colors and shapes, phonics and word families songs), Generation Genius subscription for K-8 math lessons. We also budget it for any Title 1 Parent involvement activities along with Curriculum and Teacher Professional Development.
 - a. **Instructional:** must be spent on K-2 and 3-5
 - b. Operations: materials needed to operate the school such as: toilet paper
 - c. State Allocations Restricted: Instructional supplies and Classroom supplies

2. School Improvement Survey

- a. **Instructional Staff, Students & Parents:** have not received anything back yet,
- b. **School Improvement Plan:** Survey of Extent to Implementation of SIP. Overall survey was talked about. Teachers felt a level of great extent in the areas of the goals for the SIP, the opportunity to contribute to the process of establishing the goals for the SIP, to providing feedback on the action plans and strategies that were designed by the SIP team to achieve the goals, to being aware of the action plan that depends on their support to

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active involvement in implementing the strategies to improve student learning to receiving sufficient support in implementing the strategies contained in the SIP, and implementing the strategies for improving student learning that are in the SIP. Committee members were very knowledge about our SIP from the lase meeting where the SIP was broken down to the committee. Committee felt the teachers were doing a great job trying to improve the ELA and Attendance area on SIP.
