While at the Challenger Learning Center, students took part in a Space Mission Simulation "Rendezvous with A Comet." Team members worked as scientists and engineers. Onboard astronauts in the Space Simulator worked with their counterparts in the Mission Control Simulator. These simulations provided plenty of challenges for the crews in space and on the ground. Students had the opportunity to navigate into the correct position to launch a probe to collect vital scientific information to complete the mission. When the probe broke, students had to use a 3D printer to print a new one then re-assemble the part. Other members of the crew were tasked with maintaining the health and safety of their fellow crewmates. What seemed to be a routine exploration was actually filled with challenges and emergencies. Students faced unpredictable surprises in the solar system that forced them to make quick decisions which affected the fate of the mission. It was a fun-filled day of learning which exposed students to a variety of careers in the field of engineering.
